(b) $\frac{4-j}{j+5}$
4. Given $z_{0}=a+j b, z_{1}=c+j d$, where $a, b, c, d$ are real numbers. Let

z_{2}=z_{1}-\frac{j}{z_{0}} .

(b) Find $\operatorname{Im}\left(z_{2}\right)$.
