

Solar activity was at moderate levels on 21 and 23 October with high levels the rest of the period due in large part to flare activity associated with Region 2192 (S12, L=248, class/area Fkc/2750 on 26 October). Region 2192 began producing M-class flare activity before it rotated onto the visible disk late on 16 October. By the time the region was fully apparent on 18 October, it was already classified as an Fkc spot group with an area of 1240 millionths. The region continued to grow and spread as it transited across the disk culminating in an area near 2570 millionths by 26 October (the fourth largest region since March of 1989), all the while maintaining a complex beta-gamma-delta magnetic configuration. This region managed to produce a total of 58 C-class flares, 18 M-class flares, and 5 X-class flares as of the end of the reporting period. The largest of these flares were an X1/2b at 22/1428 UTC, a long duration X3/3b at 24/2141 UTC, a long duration X1/3b at 25/1708 UTC, and an X2/2b at 26/1056 UTC. Although these were significant flares in the X-ray trace, there were no Type II or Type IV radio sweeps associated or Earth-directed coronal mass ejections.

No proton events were observed at geosynchronous orbit.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit was at moderate levels on 20 October and reached high levels for the rest of the reporting period. The highest reported value was 11,815 pfu at 22/1735 UTC.

Geomagnetic field activity ranged from quiet to minor storm levels with major storm levels reported at high latitudes. The period began under the onset of a positive polarity coronal hole high speed stream (CH HSS). Solar wind speeds increased from approximately 430 km/s to around 660 km/s by mid-day on 21 October before beginning a slow decline. Total field was initially elevated near 10 nT on 20 October before slightly decreasing while the Bz component fluctuated between +/- 8 nT. From late on 22 October through the end of the period, solar wind speeds slowly decreased from the upper 400 km/s range back to nominal solar wind conditions. The geomagnetic field responded with unsettled to minor storm levels on 20 October with major storm levels observed at high latitudes. From 21-24 October, quiet to unsettled conditions with isolated active periods prevailed. By 25-26 October, geomagnetic field activity had decreased to quiet to unsettled levels.

Space Weather Outlook **27 October - 22 November 2014**

Solar activity is likely to continue at high levels (R3-Strong or greater) from 27-30 October as Region 2192 transits off the visible disk. Very low to low levels are expected from 31 October through 10 November. By 11 November through the end of the reporting period, solar activity is expected to increase to moderate (R1-R2, Minor-Moderate) to high levels once again as Region 2192 returns on the visible disk.

A chance for a greater than 10 MeV proton event (S1-Minor or greater) exists from 27-31



October and again from 15-22 November due to potential significant flare activity from Region 2192.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at high levels from 27- 29 October and again from 18-22 November due to CH HSS activity.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at quiet to unsettled levels with isolated active periods possible on 27-29 October, 04-07 November, 10-11 November, and again from 13-22 November due to combinations of recurrent southward Bz, solar sector boundary crossings, and CH HSS. Minor storm periods are possible on 16 November due to the onset of a recurrent positive polarity CH HSS.

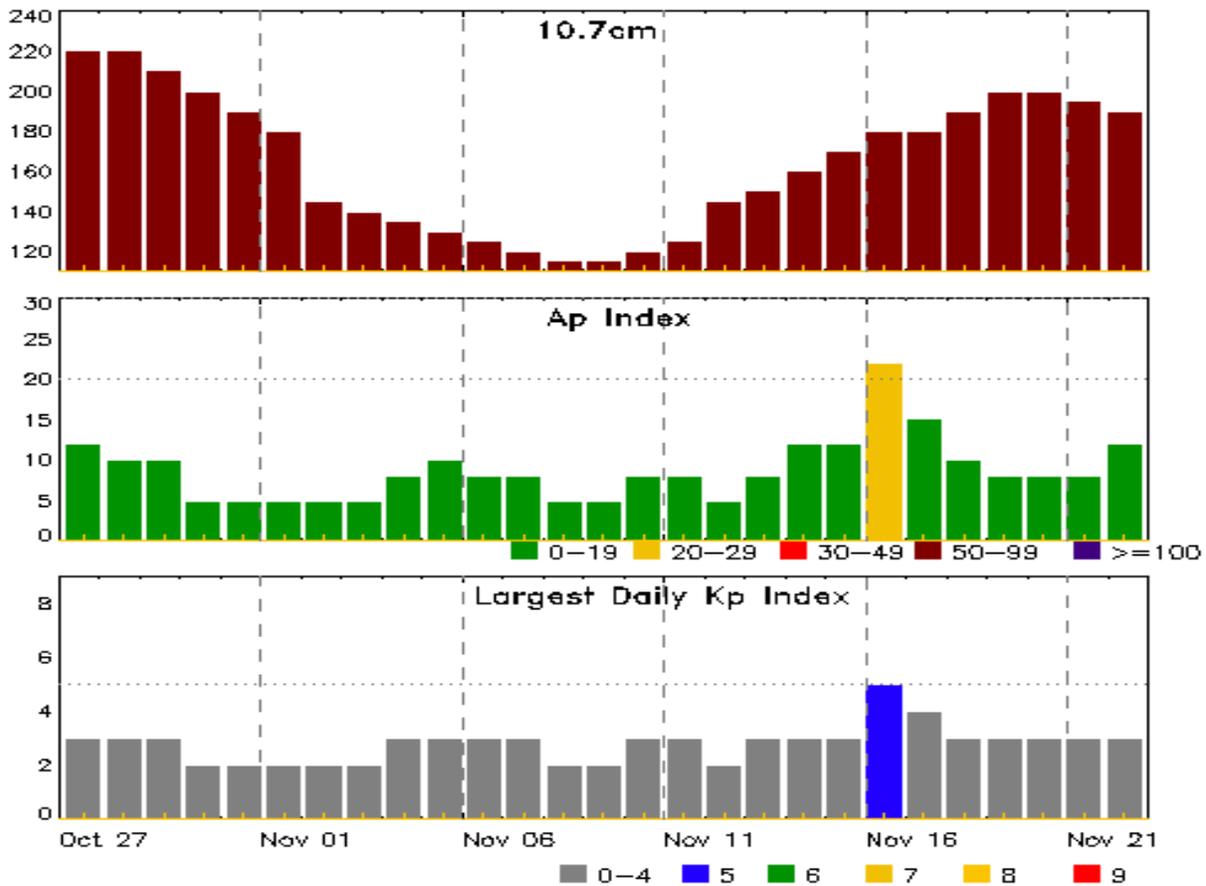

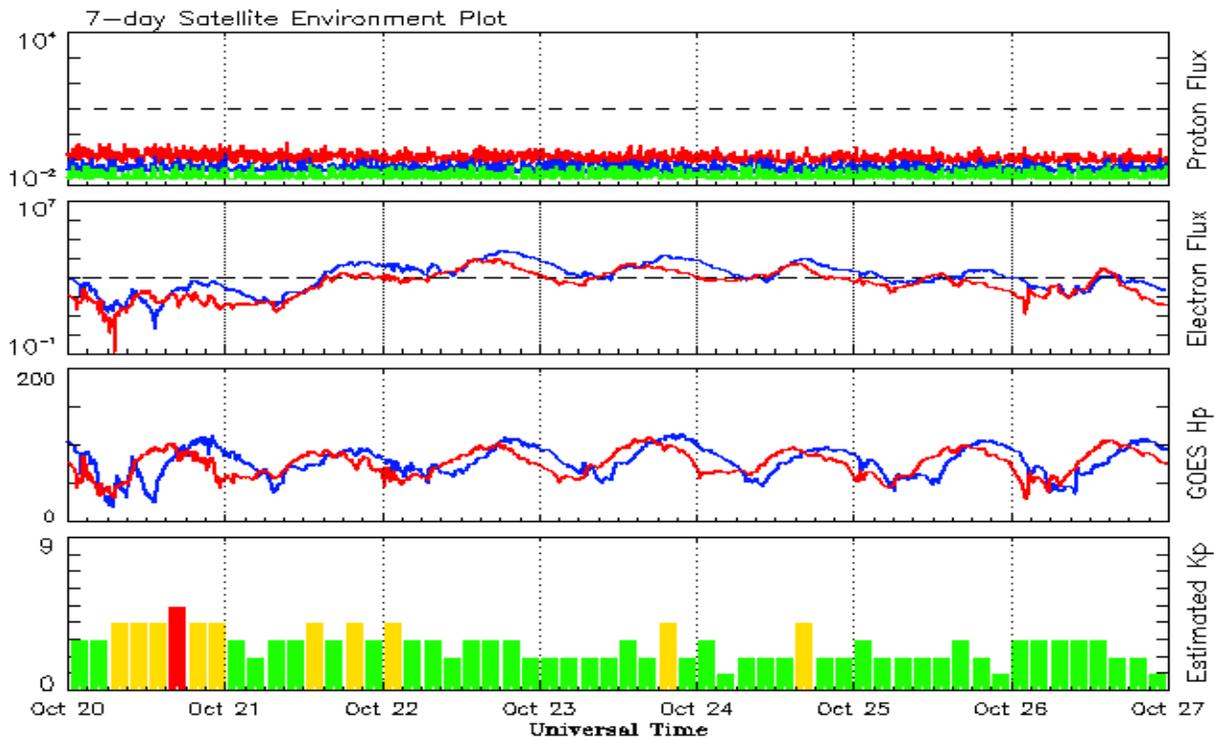

*Weekly Geosynchronous Satellite Environment Summary
Week Beginning 20 October 2014*

The proton flux plot contains the five-minute averaged integral proton flux (protons/cm²-sec -sr) as measured by the SWPC Primary GOES satellite, near West 75, for each of three energy thresholds: greater than 10, 50, and 100 MeV.

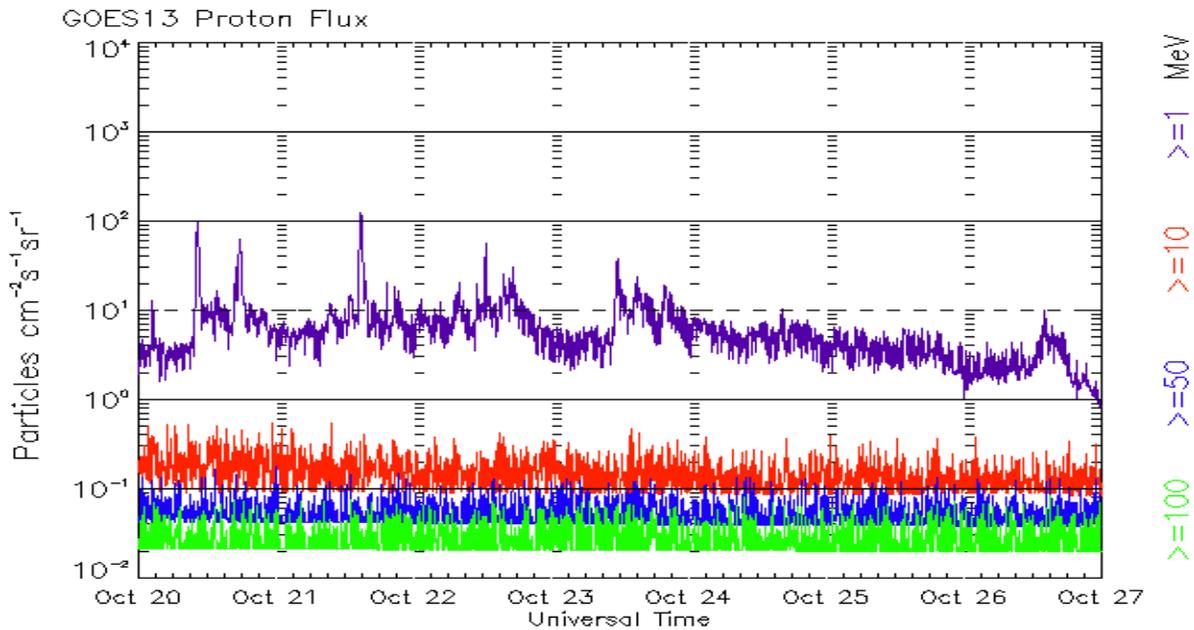
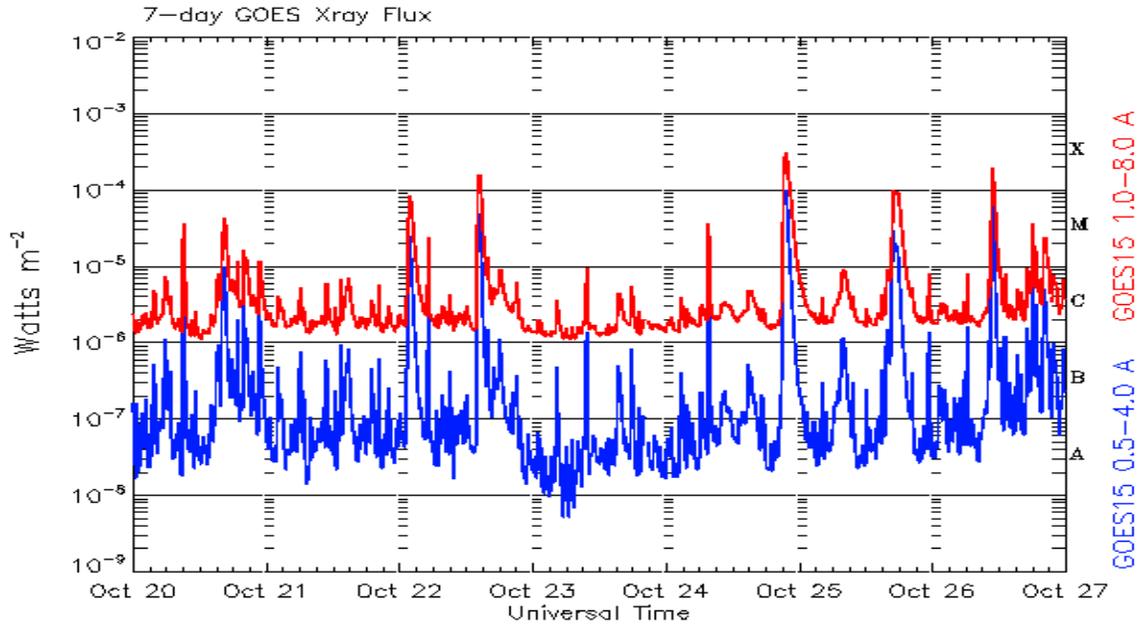
The electron flux plot contains the five-minute averaged integral electron flux (electrons/cm²-sec -sr) with energies greater than 2 MeV by the SWPC Primary GOES satellite.

The Hp plot contains the five minute averaged Hp magnetic field component in nanoteslas (nT) as by the SWPC Primary GOES satellite. The Hp component is parallel to the spin axis of the satellite, which is nearly parallel to the Earth's rotation axis.

The Estimated 3-hour Planetary Kp-index is derived at the NOAA Space Weather Prediction Center using data from the following ground-based magnetometers: Boulder, Colorado; Chambon la Foret, France; Fredericksburg, Virginia; Fresno, California; Hartland, UK; Newport, Washington; Sitka, Alaska. These data are made available thanks to the cooperative efforts between SWPC and data providers around the world, which currently includes the U.S. Geological Survey, the British Geological Survey, and the Institut de Physique du Globe de Paris.

The data included here are those now available in real time at the SWPC and are incomplete in that they do not include the full set of parameters and energy ranges known to cause satellite operating anomalies. The proton and electron fluxes and Kp are 'global' parameters that are applicable to a first order approximation over large areas. H parallel is subject to more localized phenomena and the measurements generally are applicable to within a few degrees of longitude of the measuring satellite.





*Weekly GOES Satellite X-ray and Proton Plots
Week Beginning 20 October 2014*

The x-ray plots contains five-minute averages x-ray flux (Watt/m²) as measure by the SWPC primary GOES X-ray satellite, usually at West 105 longitude, in two wavelength bands, 0.05 - 0.4 and 0.1 - 0.8 nm. The letters A, B, C, M and X refer to x-ray event levels for the 0.1 - 0.8 nm band.

The proton plot contains the five-minute averaged intergral flux units (pfu = protons/cm² -sec -sr) as measured by the primary SWPC GOES Proton satellite for each of the energy thresholds: >1, >10, >30, and >100 MeV. The P10 event threshold is 10 pfu at greater than 10 MeV.
