#### Space Weather Highlights 01 February - 07 February 2021

**SWPC PRF 2371 08 February 2021** 

Solar activity was at very low levels under a mostly spotless disk. No Earth-directed CMEs were observed in available coronagraph imagery.

No proton events were observed at geosynchronous orbit.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit was was at normal to moderate levels on 02-05 and 07 Feb. High levels occurred on 01 and 06 Feb with a maximum flux of 1,920 pfu observed at 01/1655 UTC.

Geomagnetic field activity ranged from quiet to G1 (Minor) storm levels. Quiet activity was observed on 01 Feb, but increased to quiet to active levels on 02-05 Feb due to negative polarity CH HSS influence. Quiet to G1 (Minor) storm levels were observed on 06-07 Feb due to positive polarity CH HSS influence. A maximum wind speed of 610 km/s was observed on 03/0540 UTC associated with the negative polarity CH HSS.

### Space Weather Outlook 08 February - 06 March 2021

Solar activity is expected to be at very low levels throughout the outlook period.

No proton events are expected at geosynchronous orbit.

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to be at high levels on 08-14 Feb, 22 Feb - 01 Mar and 05-06 Mar, all due to HSS effects. Normal to moderate levels are expected on 15-21 Feb and 02-04 Mar.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to be at unsettled to active levels on 08-10 Feb, 21-23 Feb, 01-02 Mar and 05-06 Mar. G1 (Minor) storm conditions are likely on 21 Feb and 06 Mar. Predominately quiet conditions are expected on 11-20 Feb, 24-28 Feb and 03-04 Mar.

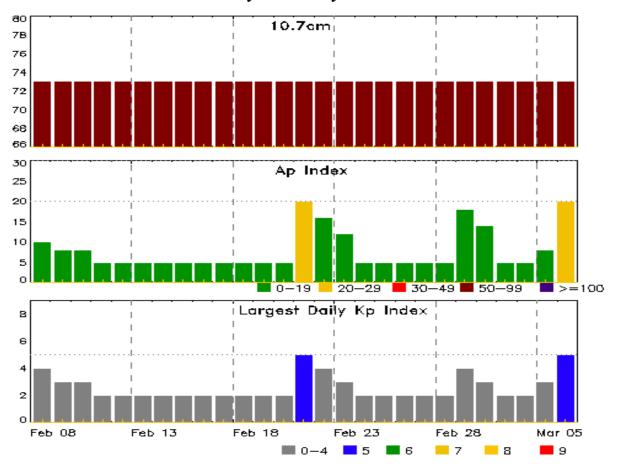
