  - (a) j
  - (b) -1
  - (c) -j-1
  - (d) 2 5j
- 2. Convert to rectangular form (x+jy):
  - (a)  $e^{j\pi}$
  - (b)  $\frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}e^{-3j\pi/4}$
  - (c)  $2e^{-j\pi/6}$
- 3. Simplify in rectangular form and then find the magnitude:
  - (a)  $(1+2j)^2$
  - (b)  $\frac{4-j}{j+5}$
- 4. Given  $z_0 = a + jb$ ,  $z_1 = c + jd$ , where a, b, c, d are real numbers. Let

$$z_2 = z_1 - \frac{j}{z_0}.$$

- (a) Find  $Re(z_2)$ .
- (b) Find  $Im(z_2)$ .
