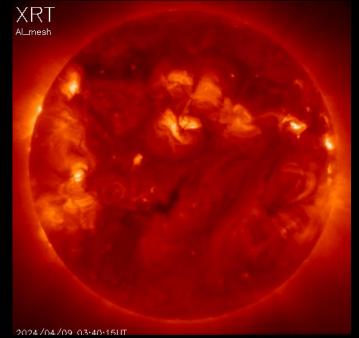
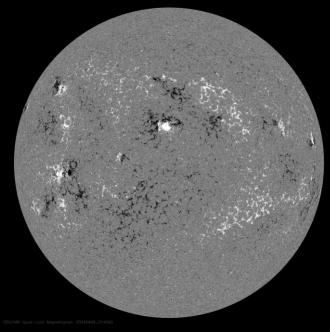

Magnetogram SDO/HMI

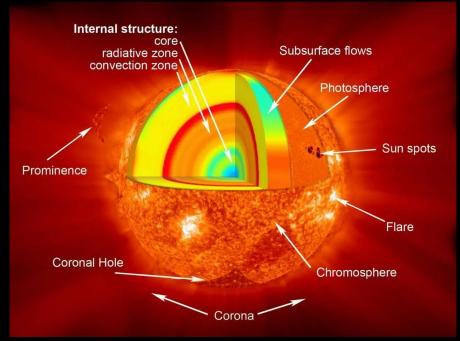


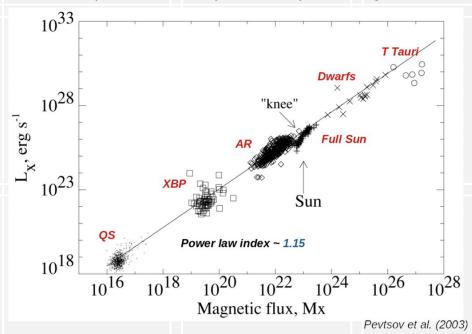

#### Project Motivation

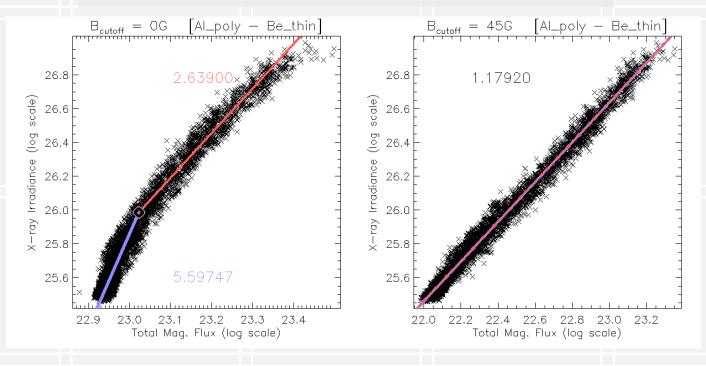
- Surface of Sun approximately (6,000K)
- $\cdot$  Corona > 1,000,000K
- Find characteristics of unknown heating mechanisms
- Use XRT (X-ray telescope) aboard the HINODE space telescope to observe the corona
- Use HMI (Helioseismic and Magnetic Imager) aboard SDO (Solar Dynamics Observatory) to observe magnetic fields
- Pevtsov et al (2003) showed relationship between X-ray luminosity and magnetic flux, leads into previous work

Relationship between X-ray luminosity and magnetic flux



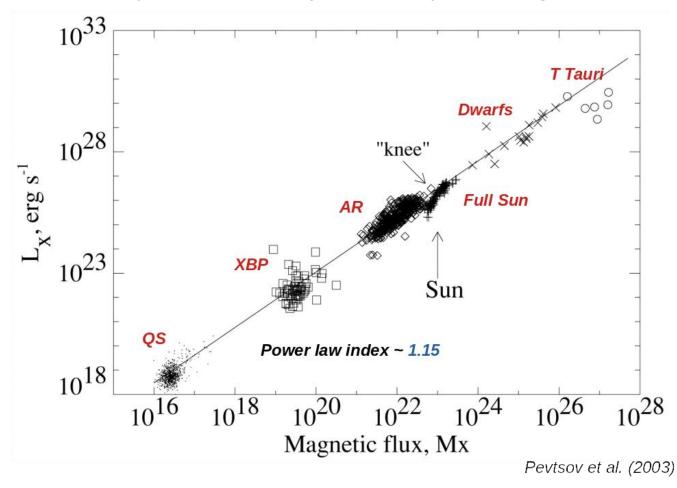
- Reproducing the knee structure

- Results show reproduction of knee is dependent on parameters chosen

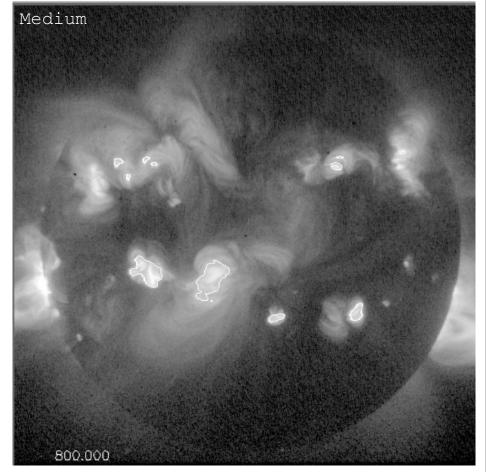


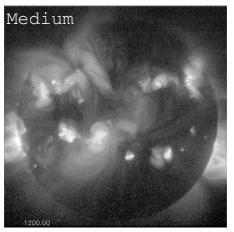
# Project Objectiv e

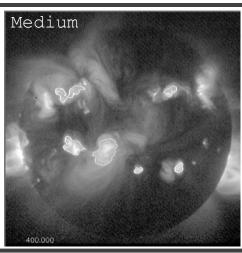
- Goal of REU project

- Plot between XBP (X-ray bright points) and AR (active region)

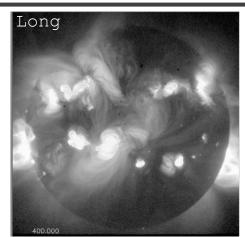
Relationship between X-ray luminosity and magnetic flux

- Learning IDL
- Made images highlighting AR of the sun using Hinode/XRT data
- Images taken May 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024
- Testing different thresholds for highlighting AR (within 0.8 solar radii)
- Looking at different exposure lengths; short (0.005108 s), medium (0.128016 s), long (0.725504 s)

#### Read a pair of XRT data Define "active region" area Derive Project "AR" area temperature(Te) and onto HMI magnetic field map emission measure(EM) Sum up flux of each pixels in "AR" Synthesize X-ray spectra X-ray irradiance Total magnetic flux
