Database of Contaminant Layer Thickness on XRT CCD

We had been able to derive the thickness of the contaminant layer from the enhancement of the G-band intensity.



This method does not look applicable to the data after around the 5th stray light increase event (2022/06/08).



G-band intensity should decrease with time



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 \rightarrow I tried to find another method using X-ray data, with no success so far...

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 \rightarrow use "extrapolation" to guess the thickness after 2022/05/22

Thickness calculation after 2022/05/22

Increase of "base" : linear extrapolation Accumulation rate : 6.7A/day (non-eclipse season) 2.3A/day (eclipse season)
